

L1.2 MASTER OF MARINE AIDS TO NAVIGATION MANAGEMENT COURSE BUSAN, THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA, 29 JUNE TO 03 JULY 2026

BACKGROUND

The Master of AtoN Management Course (Level 1.2) is tailored for senior management personnel involved in the governance and strategic direction of Marine Aids to Navigation (AtoN) services. It provides advanced knowledge and leadership tools to strengthen the capacity of national administrations and competent authorities in managing AtoN systems effectively.

Building on the Level 1.1 AtoN Manager Course, which focuses on operational and technical aspects, this programme takes a strategic and governance-oriented approach. Participants will gain a deeper understanding of policy development, institutional frameworks, and management practices essential for ensuring sustainable and efficient AtoN service delivery.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This course strengthens the capacity of senior managers involved in the public administration of Marine Aids to Navigation (AtoN). At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Discuss governance frameworks and institutional responsibilities for AtoN services.
- Discuss effective public policies and strategic management approaches.
- Enhance stakeholder coordination and sustainable funding strategies.
- Plan organizational resources and prepare strategic development plans.

The programme combines expert-led sessions with a group exercise analysing the strategy and governance of an AtoN authority.

ATTENDEES

The course is intended for senior professionals in the public administration of AtoN services.

Participants should ideally:

- Have completed the IALA Level 1.1 AtoN Manager Course with relevant experience; or
- Hold at least five years of proven AtoN or maritime administration experience.
