Opening of the General Assembly

The General Assembly witnessed welcome speeches from Mr Teo Chee Han, Senior Minister and Coordinating Minister for National Security, Arsenio Dominguez IMO Secretary-General, Mathias Jonas IHO Secretary-General, Laurent Parenté IMSO Director General and Francis Zachariae IALA Secretary-General.

The Secretary-General then proceeded to introducing agenda points I.4.1 and I.4.2. He explained that in order to commemorate this significant milestone and in recognition of the first ordinary General Assembly of the Organization, the General Assembly was invited to consider the adoption of a Declaration. The Declaration will serve as a high-level document reflecting the Organization's new role as an IGO and its vision for the future.

The Declaration outlines the Organizations' core values and emphasizes its strengthened collaboration with other IGOs to foster strong, cooperative international relationships. Additionally, it reinforces the Organization's global, harmonized vision on key topics such as the Maritime Buoyage System, the digitalization of Marine Aids to Navigation and the transition to a greener future.

It provides a forward-looking framework that marks the Organization's leadership role in Marine Aids to Navigation and its commitment to global cooperation, sustainability and innovation in the maritime sector and provides guidance for the future activities and priorities of the Organization.

The Declaration was developed by a special group of the Transition Council of the Organization and unanimously approved as an input document by the Transition Council in December 2024.

The declaration on the International Organization for Marine Aids to Navigation was adopted.

(a) Adoption of the Agenda

Input papers a.1.1 and a.1.2 refer.

The agenda was approved and can be found at Annex A.

(b) Approval of the General Regulations and Financial Regulations

Input papers b.1.1, b.1.2, b.1.3, b.1.4, and b.1.5 refer.

The draft General Regulations and Financial Regulations, paper b.1.2, was developed in line with the draft Convention and was presented in the input papers to all the pre-diplomatic Conferences and the final Diplomatic Conference in Kuala Lumpur in 2020. Since the third pre-diplomatic Conference in Istanbul the draft of the General Regulations and Financial Regulations was no longer discussed but submitted as an input paper. The Secretariat adapted the draft General Regulations and Financial Regulations according to the final Convention text after the Diplomatic Conference. After the Convention was closed for signatures in January 2022 and several States had either ratified or acceded to the Convention, a Conference was held in November 2023 in Tokyo to develop the draft General Regulations of the Organization to a final draft ready for adoption by this General Assembly.

Australia suggested to precise in the Financial Regulations, under Article 2.5 (b) the following: "prepare the financial statements under International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS)".

The resolution on the General Regulations and Financial Regulations was adopted.

The resolution on the Delegation of Responsibility from the General Assembly to the Council was adopted.

(c) Election of the President and the Vice President

Input papers c.1 and c.1 annex refer.

As there was only one candidate for one position, the Secretary-General suggested to elect Brazil by acclamation as the President of IALA until the next session of the General Assembly in 2027.

As for the President, there was only one candidate for the position of Vice President, and the Secretary-General suggested to elect India by acclamation until the next General Assembly in 2027.

The General Assembly elected Brazil as President and India as Vice President.

(d) Report of the Secretary-General

The Secretary-General, Francis Zachariae, gave an overview of the day-to-day business of the organization to the assembly. He presented the history of the change of status, the transition period, the member states, the overall membership, the changes in the staff, the committees work and future workshops and seminars, the World-Wide Academy and the new Headquarters plan.

The General Assembly noted the Secretary-General's report.

(e) Election of the Council

Input papers e.1.1 and e.1.1 annexes refer.

The General Assembly was required, in accordance with the Convention Article 7.7 (d) and 8, to elect the Council from amongst the Member States other than the Member States holding the Presidency or Vice Presidency – Brazil and India. The Secretariat received 24 candidatures for only 23 available seats. 36 delegations voted by single ballot (37 with the exception of Egypt, which was not present).

The General Assembly elected the council members as follows:

(f) Election of the Secretary-General

The General Assembly was required, in accordance with the Convention Article 7.7(e), to elect the Secretary-General from amongst nationals of the member States in accordance with the General Regulations.

The transition Secretary-General has in accordance with the Circular Letter IGO 01/2024 of 22 August 2024 invited interested Member States to submit candidates for the position of Secretary-General until 17 January 2025. Nominations for Secretary-General were notified to Member States as soon as they were received.

The only candidate for the position of Secretary-General was from Denmark nominating Mr. Francis Zachariae and was therefore elected by acclamation.

The General Assembly elected Francis Zachariae from Denmark as Secretary-General.

(g) Establishment and termination of Committees and Subsidiary Bodies and review and approval of their Terms of Reference

Input papers g.1.1, g.1.2, g.2.1, g.2.2 refer.

In accordance with No. 2 of the transitional arrangements of the Convention, the Committees of the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities have operated until Committees are established under the Convention. According to Article 7.7 (f) of the Convention, the General Assembly shall establish Committees and approve their Terms of Reference.

The present four committees and their four-year work program were agreed at the General Assembly of the Association held in Rio de Janeiro in June 2023 ending in 2027. In ensuring a smooth transition from the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities to the Organization and to secure the continuation of the technical work of the Committees during this time, the transition Council proposed to keep the four Committees from the Association:

- AtoN Requirements and Management (ARM)
- Engineering and Sustainability (ENG)
- Digital Technologies (DTEC)
- Vessel Traffic Services (VTS)

as the Committees of the Organization.

The draft Terms of Reference were developed in line with the Convention and the draft General Regulations and apply to all Committees of the Organization to provide good governance and secure a smooth and harmonized operation in the work of all Committees.

The Terms of Reference were agreed by the Policy Advisory Panel, where all Chairs and Vice Chairs have a seat, the Legal Advisory Panel and by the Transition Council.

Sweden proposed a small change to the ToR to better align the text with the reference documents by adding the word “Marine” to the aims and objectives.

The Resolution on the Establishment of Committees and their Terms of Reference was adopted.

According to the Convention Article 7.7 (f) the General Assembly shall establish subsidiary bodies and approve their Terms of Reference.

As for the Committees in ensuring a smooth transition from the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities to the Organization and to secure the continuation of the work of the subsidiary bodies, the transitional Council proposed to keep the two subsidiary bodies from the association:

- Policy Advisory Panel (PAP)
- Legal Advisory Panel (LAP)

as the subsidiary bodies of the Organization.

The draft Terms of Reference were developed in line with the Convention and the draft General Regulations by the Secretariat and agreed by the Policy Advisory panel, the Legal Advisory Panel and the Transition Council.

The Resolution on the Establishment of Subsidiary Bodies and their Terms of Reference was adopted.

(h) Review and approval of the financial arrangements

Input paper h.1.1, h.1.2 refer.

In line with Article 7.7 (g) the General Assembly shall approve the financial arrangements of the Organization including the outline budget for the following three years and the rate of contributions for Member States and fees for Associate Members and Affiliate Members.

The Finance and Audit Committee of the transition Council in line with the General Regulations of the association mutatis mutandis advised the transition Council on the three-year outline budget and the contributions for Member States and fees for Associate Members and Affiliate Industrial Members and other Affiliate Members.

The transition Council in accordance with Article 3 of the Financial Regulations has agreed and proposed the three-year outline budget 2025-2026-2027 and the rates of contributions for Member States and fees for Associate Members to the General Assembly for approval.

The budget was drafted on the assumption that IALA will proceed with the transfer of staff, assets and liabilities after the General Assembly.

Concerning the relocation project, the decision was taken to move the IALA Headquarters to a larger place in Saint Germain-en-Laye in mid-2026. The construction of a 400 m² plenary room next to the building is scheduled for end of 2027. The total purchase cost of the building and the plenary room is 4.4 million euros.

According to a schedule of payment made over a period from 2025 to 2028, the French government shall contribute more than half of the budget and IALA shall contribute 2 million euros - 1.5 million euros from the sale of the existing headquarters and the remainder from the reserves that have been set aside in the balance sheet for this purpose for several years. The city of Saint Germain-en-Laye and the Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs might also contribute to finance some purchase of equipment for the new HQ.

An increase in the membership rate was to be applied to all categories over the period. It was proposed to differentiate between Member States and Associate Members from 2026, as Associate Members do not have voting rights and are not eligible for Council positions.

The Resolution on the Financial arrangements was adopted.

(i) Transfer of the Strategic Vision

Input paper i.1.1, i.1.2, i.1.3 refer.

The International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities had a strategic vision which was developed by a strategy drafting group elected from among the Council members. The last revision of the strategic vision of the association was accepted by its General Assembly in Rio de Janeiro in June 2023.

With the winding up of the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities, the strategic vision was not automatically the strategic vision of the Organization.

Since the Organization did not undertake the task to develop a new strategic vision, the transition Council recommended adopting the strategic vision including the current driver and trends of the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities as the strategic vision of the Organization.

The Secretariat will carry out the necessary editorial changes to adapt the strategic vision and the current driver and trends to the Organization.

The Resolution on the Strategic Vision was adopted.

(j) Transfer of the standards and other relevant papers

Input paper j.1.1 and j.1.2 refer.

The International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities published standards, recommendations, guidelines, manuals, model courses and other documents related to Marine Aids to Navigation. These documents were published either in writing, on the homepage of the association or both in writing and digital. All these documents were essential to the aims and objectives of the association, especially with regard to the improvement and international harmonization of Marine Aids to Navigation for the benefit of the maritime community and the protection of the marine environment.

There was no automatic transfer of documents as both the association and the Organization are different legal entities. Consequently, it was necessary for the Organization to formally transfer all the official technical documents of the International Association for Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities to the Organization with a decision by the General Assembly.

The Secretariat will carry out the necessary editorial changes to adapt the respective documents being recognized as those of the Organization.

The Resolution on the transfer of standards and other relevant papers was adopted.

(k) Decision on Associate membership

Input paper k.1.1, k.1.2, k.1.3, k.1.4, k.1.5 refer.

In accordance with the Convention Article 3.2 an Associate Member means a territory or group of territories for which a Member State has responsibility for its international relations and for which it has requested membership which has been approved by the General Assembly, and national members of the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities from States that are not Member States, in accordance with paragraph 5 of the Annex.

According to the Convention Article 5.2, any Member State having responsibility for the international relations of a territory or a group of territories may request Associate membership for such territory or group of territories, by notification in writing to the Secretary-General. The Secretariat will then submit requests for Associate membership to the General Assembly for a decision.

The Secretariat has received notifications from the United Kingdom for Bermuda, the Kingdom of Denmark for the Faroe Islands and from Peoples republic of China for Hong Kong. All three are National members of the association. The notifications can be found in papers k.1.3, k.1.4 and k.1.5.

The Resolution on Associate membership was adopted.

(l) Consideration of reports and proposals received by the Member States, the Council or the Secretary-General

Input paper l.1.1, l.1.2, l.2.1, l.2.2, l.3.1, l.3.2, l.4.1, l.4.2, l.5.1, l.6.1, l.6.1.a, l.6.1.b, l.6.2 refer.

By becoming an intergovernmental organization, the Organization no longer fell automatically under the jurisdiction of the French judiciary system. This applied specifically to all matters regarding the relation between the Organization and its staff such as the terms of employment or the provisions of the Staff Rules. In the final appeals procedure foreseen in the Staff Rules and as approved by the Transition Council, the Organization recognized the jurisdiction of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organization.

The Organization needed to formally recognize the jurisdiction of the ILOAT by presenting its willingness to accept the jurisdiction of the Administrative Tribunal to the Director-General of ILOAT. The Administrative Tribunal then proceeded subject to its own rules to accept the Organization's willingness to recognize the ILOAT's jurisdiction.

The Resolution on the ILOAT was adopted.

International Governmental Organizations agree on Headquarters Agreements with their respective host nation. In these Headquarters Agreement the privileges and immunities of the Organization and its staff in the territory of the host nation are agreed.

The Organization and the French Republic have agreed a final draft of the Headquarters Agreement. As it can take up to two years before the formal procedure for such agreements in France are finalized, a temporary arrangement with the same content (“ordonnance”) will be established in order for the Organization and its staff to benefit from the rights and privileges. This was in accordance with the normal procedure for International Organizations in France.

The agreement dealt with the rights and obligations in relation to the premises of the Organization, immunity and tax exemption, the rights of the representatives of Member States and resident permits for staff members. Article 13 specifically mentioned the rights of staff members to remain in the French social security system in case the Organization wished to do so.

The Resolution on the Headquarters Agreement was adopted.

In accordance with the Convention on the International Organization for Marine Aids to Navigation the first General Assembly of the International Organization for Marine Aids to Navigation must take place within six months of the entry into force of the Convention, and in accordance with the Transition Arrangements of the Convention.

Consequently, the date for the first General Assembly - 18-21 February 2025 - was related to the entry into force of the Convention on 22 August 2024 and not to a regular cycle of meetings. The time between August 2024 and February 2025 was needed to complete all necessary tasks of the transition phase such as the transition of staff and the transfer of assets and liabilities.

According to Article 7.4 of the Convention and Article 3.1 of the General Regulations the regular session of the General Assembly shall ordinarily take place once every three years.

Article 3.2 of the General Regulations states the regular session of the General Assembly should, where possible, be convened during the same period and at the same location as the Organization’s conference “but in any case, must be held no earlier than June of the General Assembly year”.

As explained above, the first General Assembly took place in February 2025 and not as foreseen in the General Regulations “no earlier than June of the General Assembly year”. In that sense the date of the first General Assembly must be seen as an exception due to the restraints of the entry into force of the Convention.

In accordance with the General Regulations Article 3.2, the Council may for reasons of necessity, determine an alternative time for convening the General Assembly. The Transition Council made such a decision at its meeting in June 2024.

The Resolution on the next session of the General Assembly was adopted.

The World-Wide Academy is funded entirely by sponsorships. For many years, Korea, Singapore and Malaysia have generously and continuously sponsored the Academy through Memoranda of Understanding (MoU) with each a duration of three to four years.

To ensure the continuation of these sponsorships and the continuous operation of the World-Wide Academy, and in accordance with the Transition Arrangements of the Convention, these MoU’s would be transferred to the Organization through a simple amendment to each MoU, replacing the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Association with the International Organization for Marine Aids to Navigation as party to the MoU.

The signing took place between the Secretary-General, Singapore, The Republic of Korea and France.

The Ministry of Oceans and Fisheries (MOF) of the Republic of Korea has offered its generous support to IALA to strengthen the development and harmonization of AtoN worldwide, focusing exclusively on technical cooperation.

Subject to the decision of the General Assembly, this technical cooperation agreement will be added to resolution I.6.2 Draft resolution on agreements with IMO and IHO [and the Republic of Korea].

The International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities has a long-standing cooperation with the International Maritime Organization (IMO) and the International Hydrographic Organization (IHO).

As a non-governmental organization, the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities has held consultative status with IMO since 1961. In November 2024 France as the depositary to the IALA Convention submitted on behalf of the Organization a submission to the IMO Council in line with the procedures and terms of cooperation between IMO and intergovernmental organizations (IMO Assembly Resolution A.1168(32)). This submission requested formal cooperation between the Organization and IMO subject to the adoption of the Resolution by the General Assembly. This includes primarily the right to observe and submit documents to meetings and conferences convened by or under the auspices of IMO subject to its procedures for meetings and conferences. At the same time the IMO may be invited to send observers and submit documents to meetings and conferences convened by or under the auspices of the Organization subject to its procedures for meetings and conferences. After approval by the IMO Council, the IMO Secretary-General will submit the request of the Organization to the IMO Assembly for approval.

The International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities concluded a cooperation agreement with IHO in 2001. While the terms and conditions of this cooperation agreement still apply to the cooperation with IHO, the Organization needed to conclude a new agreement with IHO reflecting on its new status. The IHO Assembly has to approve agreements with international organizations.

The Resolution on agreements with States and International Organizations was adopted.

(m) Any other business

Australia took the floor and suggested that all the women holding a head of agency position present at the Assembly gather for a photo. In the spirit of enhanced collaboration, the head of delegation for Australia also expressed her endeavor to put in place a network between all the head of agencies of IALA.
