To the extent that a state joins the OGI, it recognizes the international legal personality. The terms of this recognition may vary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- marginally and possibly for one state and are addressed in the <u>act of accession</u>,</li> <li>- more substantially /surely for the hosting country and are specified in the <u>Headquarters agreement</u>.</li> </ul> <p>This issue is not supposed to be addressed in the para 1. of this article; the wording of the para 2. is appropriate and sufficient in itself.<br/>So: “1. <i>The Organization has international legal personality and has capacity to: etc</i>”</p> |
