The World-Wide Academy

The vehicle by which IALA delivers training and capacity building

- Started in January 2012
- Independently funded
- Focused on Strategic Goal 2
- Facilitates both AtoN and VTS training
- Develops capacity building in 5 key regions





The IALA World-Wide Academy

The role of the Academy is to take the Standards, the Recommendations, the Guidelines, and the Guides prepared by the Committees and adopted by the Council, and to bring them to the knowledge of those in charge of AtoN and VTS, mainly in developing countries.

Then to assist the Authorities to implement them in their own countries.

Regarding training, the aim of The Academy is normally not to deliver training itself, but to facilitate both AtoN and VTS training through harmonized curriculum and model courses, and an accreditation process.
