Draft Convention text – discussion paper

The LAP has looked at detailing the blueprint in the draft convention text, i.e. list of functions of General Assembly, Council and Secretary-General.

LAP has examined the blueprint left in the draft Convention text, and at the current IALA Constitution, draft General Regulations for current IALA and the two most similar IGO – conventions (IHO and WMO). By putting all these into the same document it might be easier to pick up the best from the available sources. The yellow color is used to mark text that is covered by the proposed finalized draft convention text (second column). Non-yellow text is either not necessary to cover, due to the level of detail or because it is covered elsewhere.

The following guiding principles were used:

- Adapt current IALA practice to fit into an IGO context, where possible
- Empower Council as far as possible, keeping in mind the need for states to have sufficient control with the operation of the through General Assembly
- Leave details to General Regulations, where possible
