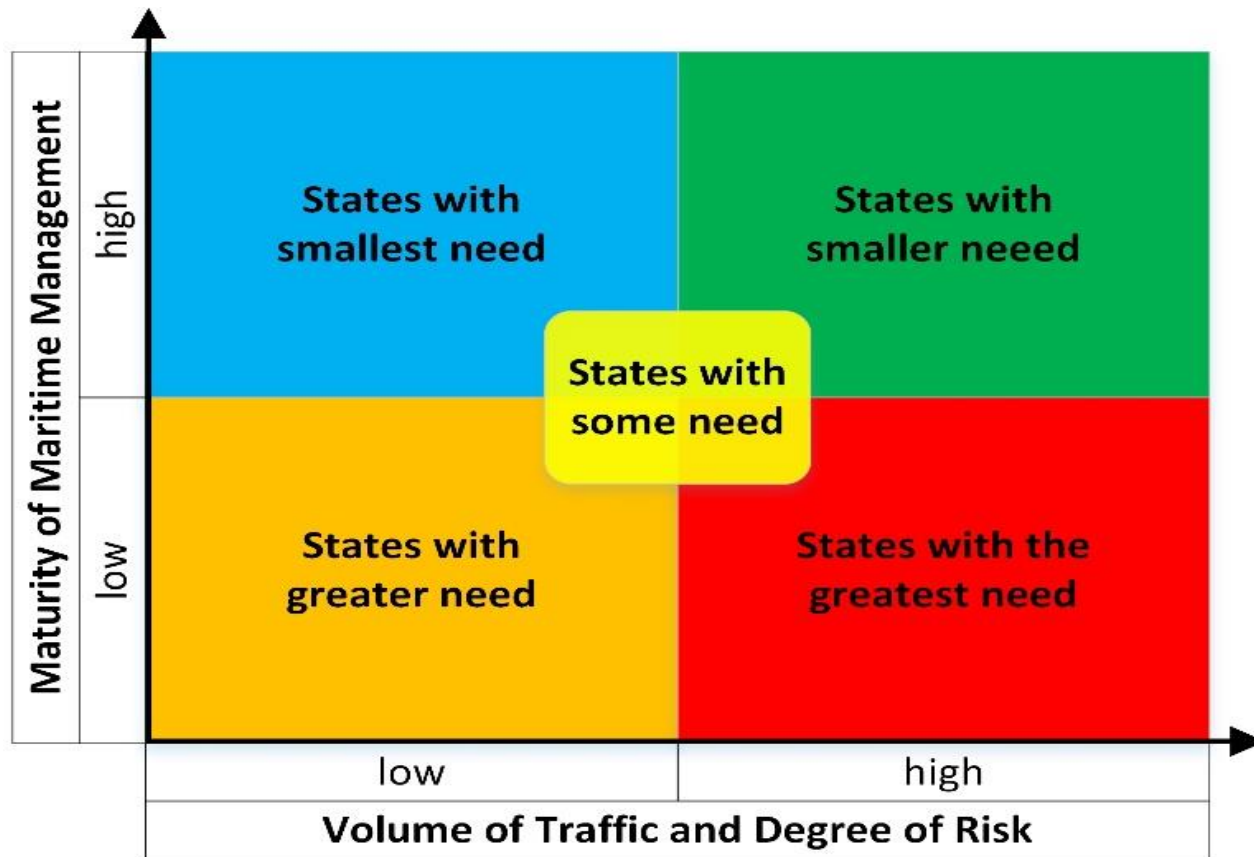

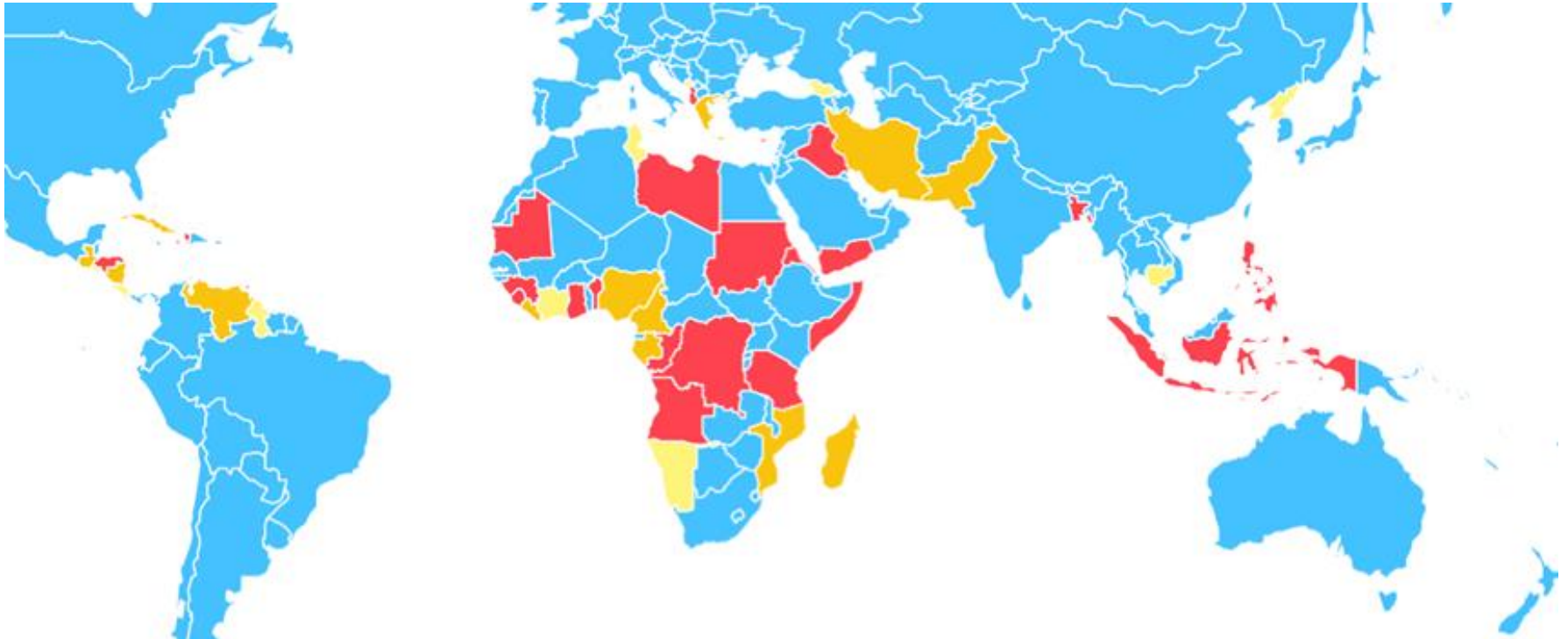
Capacity Building strategy

- **Priority 3** States have some need.

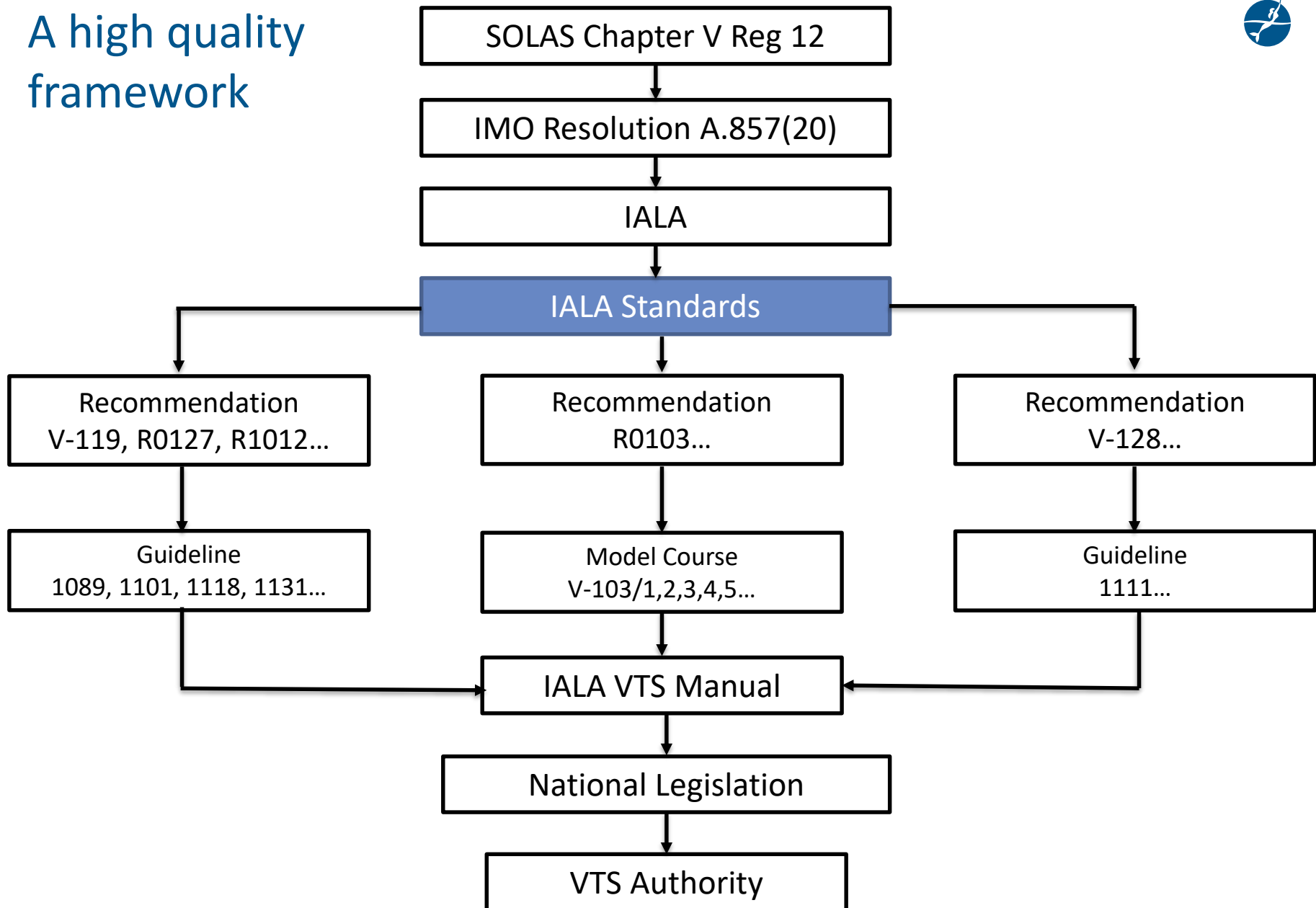


Capacity Building operations

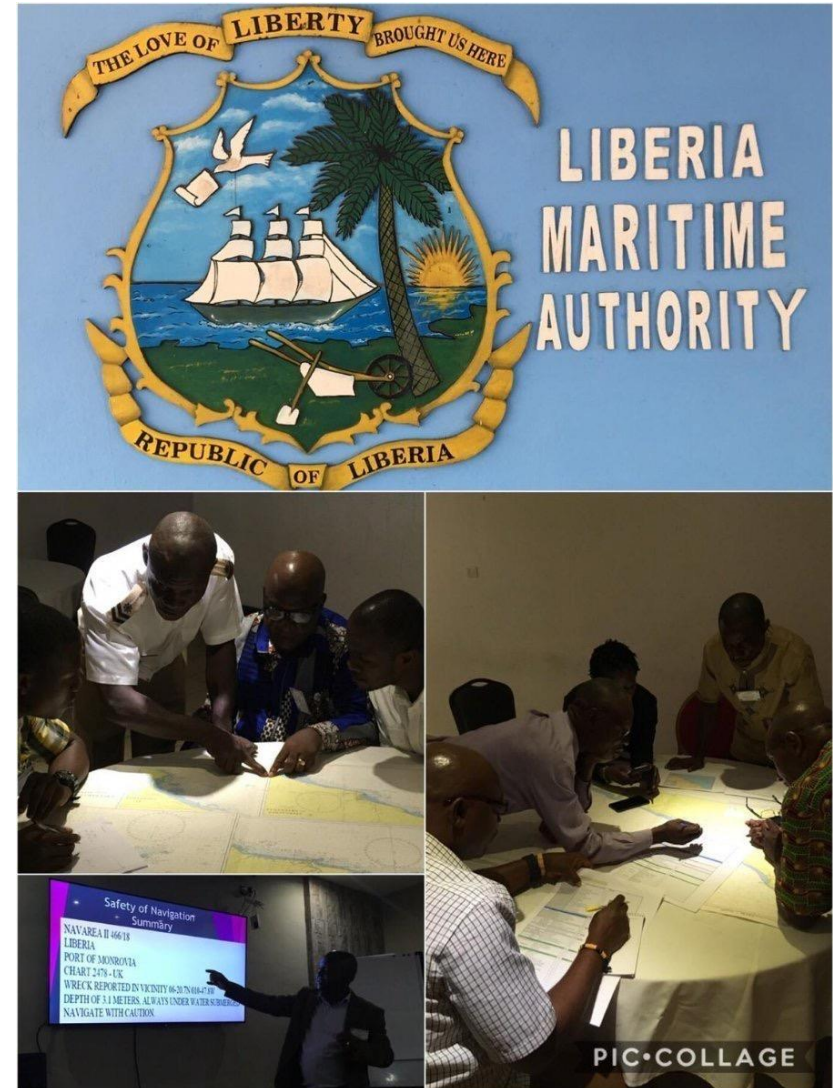
