# Strategic Vision and Goals for 2026

## Goal 1

Ensure that aids to navigation systems and related services, including e-Navigation, Vessel Traffic Services, and emerging technologies, are harmonized through international cooperation and the provision of standards.

## Goal 2

All coastal states have contributed to an efficient **global** network of **aids to navigation** and services for the safety of navigation, **through capacity building and the sharing of expertise.**





## Capacity Building Strategy

### Technical Needs Assessment **Missions**

IALA-funded mission at request of Competent Authorities

Competent Authority analyses recommendations from missions and produces a prioritised action list with realistic target dates for implementation or completion

**Review** – Competent Authority invites IALA to review agreed action list with the aim of removing the State from its target list

## Selection of Target States

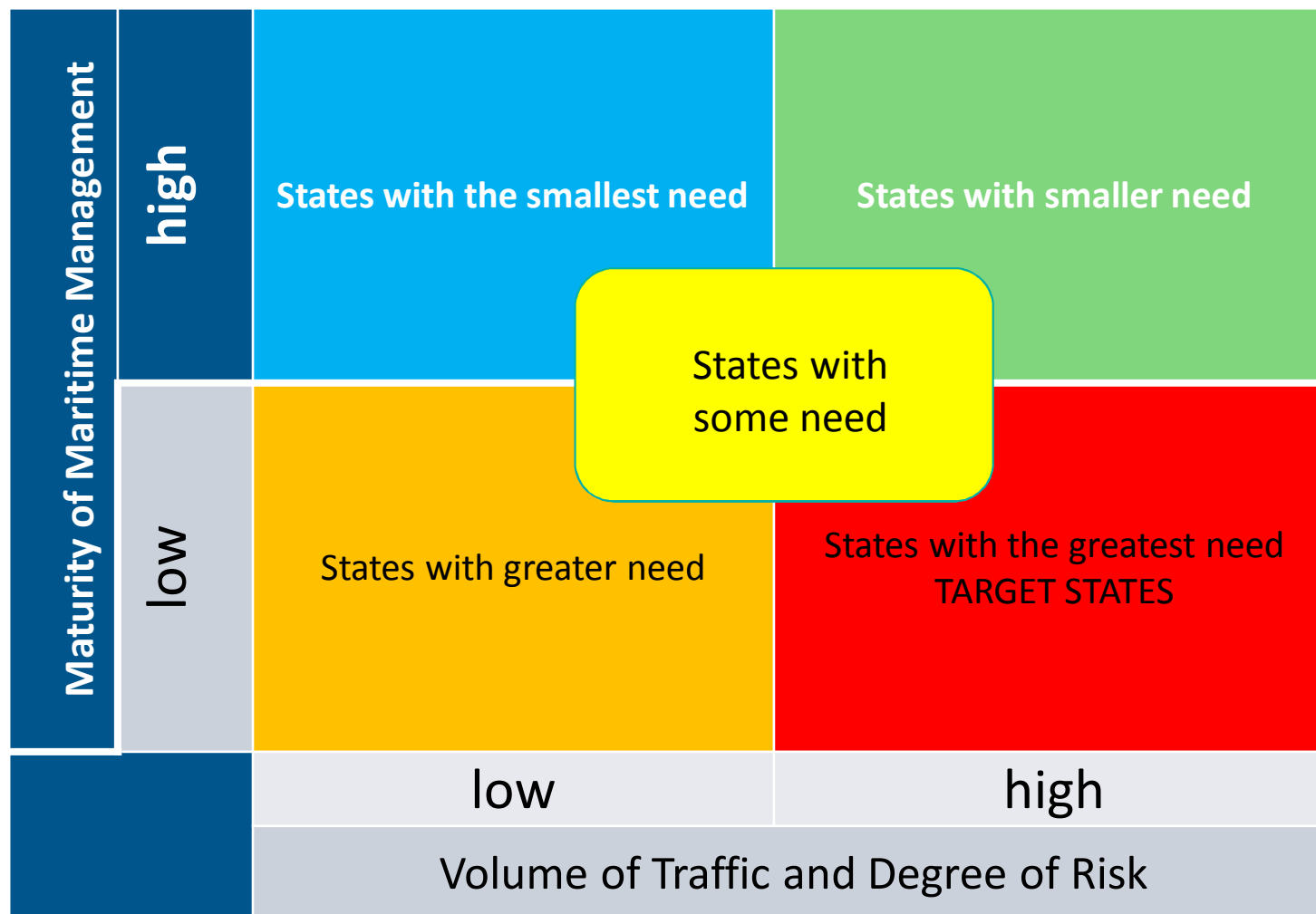
“The Academy will primarily focus its capacity building efforts on those Target States with **greatest need** with a view of steadily **reducing the total number** of Target States.” (Quote from 2017 Master Plan)

If a State is on the target list, it has yet to demonstrate its capability to meet its **obligations** under SOLAS Chapter V so that **Maritime Safety Information** (MSI) and **AtoN services** are delivered to full international standards

Target States are assessed using a confidential matrix of the **maturity** of maritime management on one axis and the **volume of traffic and degree of risk** on the other (12 criteria on each axis)
