### 15 –MEMBERSHIP

#### *15.3 –Terminations and suspensions of membership*

Note by the Secretariat

#### 1. BACKGROUND

Since the last Council session and after the Secretariat had exhausted all efforts to have the outstanding contributions settled with no success, the following organizations are in position to be removed from IALA membership or have their rights suspended:

#### 2. TERMINATIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

- **PRODAR, the United States of America (4EUN138)**. This organization has been a member since 2019. No reaction was observed since their suspension by CL74. They owe three years of contributions.

#### 3. UPDATE ON SUSPENDED MEMBERSHIP

- **Office National de Signalisation Maritime, Algeria (1ALGE01)**. This organization has been a member since 1963 and was suspended at Council 69. It is believed that when IALA becomes an IGO, this will facilitate the administrative payment process. They still owe the contribution of the year 2019. A suggestion is made to Council to consider cancelling this debt and propose a cooperation under new basis.
- **Direction Générale de la Marine Marchande, Rep of Congo (1RCON01)**. This Organization still owes one year of contribution. However, the Minister attended the Signing ceremony and signed the Convention on 26 January. A suggestion is made to Council to consider cancelling this debt and propose a cooperation under new basis.

#### 4. PROPOSAL FOR NEW MEMBERSHIP SUSPENSIONS

It is proposed to suspend the following membership before a possible termination by the next Council in December 2022, keeping in mind that rights suspension may lead to a reaction of those who wish to keep their membership:

Industrial membership

- **Shandong Buoy & Pipe Industry Co. Ltd., People's Republic of China (4CHIN06)**: this organization has been a member since 2011. They owe three years of contributions.
- **Chaohu Qunli Marine Anchor Chain Co Ltd., People's Republic of China (4CHIN12)**: this organization was waived the contributions for the years 2019 and 2020 at Council 73, with the promise to pay the contribution for the year 2021 by August at the latest. To date, no payment has been received.
- **Qingdao Hotech Automated, People's Republic of China (4CHIN19)**: this organization has joined IALA in 2020. They have never paid any contribution.

- **Pesona Global Teknologi, PT; Indonesia (4INDO09):** this organization has joined IALA in 2019. They have not settled any contribution.
- **Harmoz Berkeh, Ertebat Electronic Gil; Iran (4IRAN04):** this organization has been a member since 2020. They have not settled any contribution.
- **Leonardo S.p.a, Italy (4ITAL03):** this organization has been a member since 1994 and is also very active in the VTS Committee. They owe three years of contributions.
- **Navalec S.A de CV, Mexico (4MEXI01):** this organization has been a member since 2019. They informed IALA that they were not in the position to pay due to the impact of the pandemic. They were proposed a repayment plan, with no success. They owe three years of contributions.
- **AD Engineering Limited, Papua New Guinea (4PAPO03):** this organization has been a member since 2018. They owe three years of contributions.
- **Maximum Protective Service Intl N.V, Suriname (4SURIO1):** this organization became a member in 2020. They owe three years of contributions.

#### Associate Membership

- **Electronics and Telecommunication Research Institute, Republic of Korea (3RCOR02):** this organization has been a member since 2011. They owe three years of contributions.
- **Marine Transport Institute, Democratic Republic of Korea (3RPCO01):** this organization has been a member since 2016. They have been raising their difficulties to pay due to the embargo. They wish to stay a member. They owe five years of contributions.
