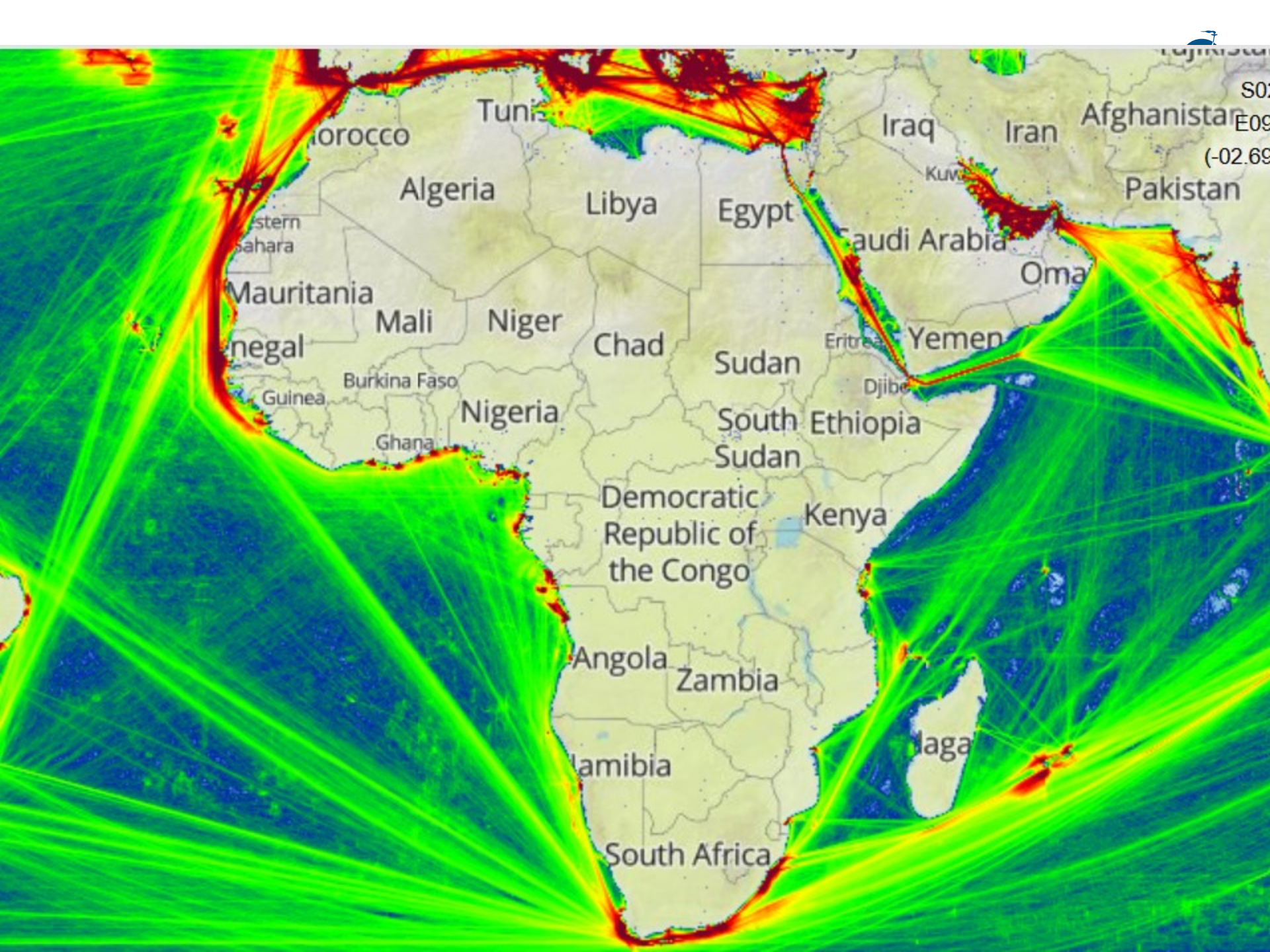


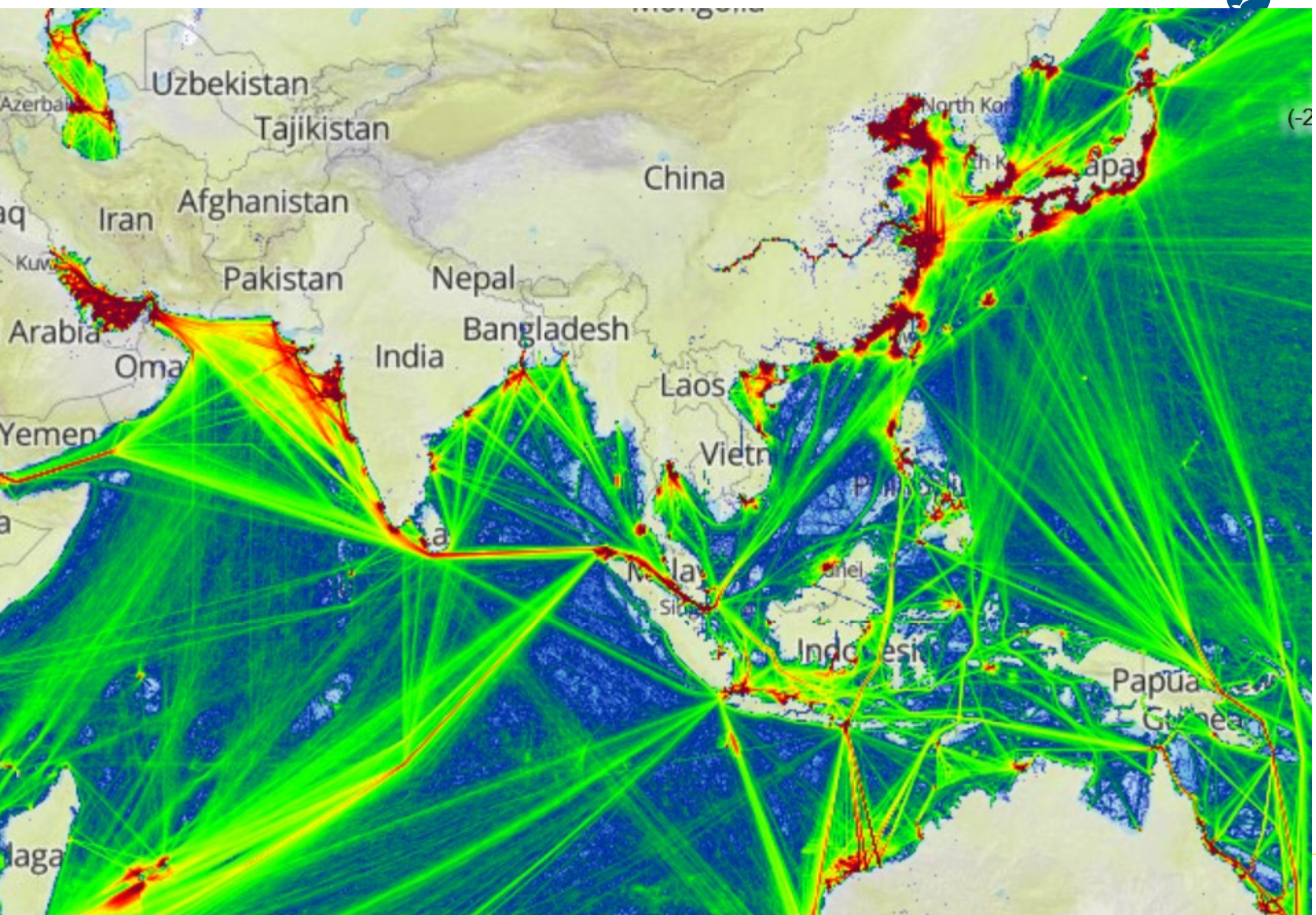
Vessel Traffic Density Plot

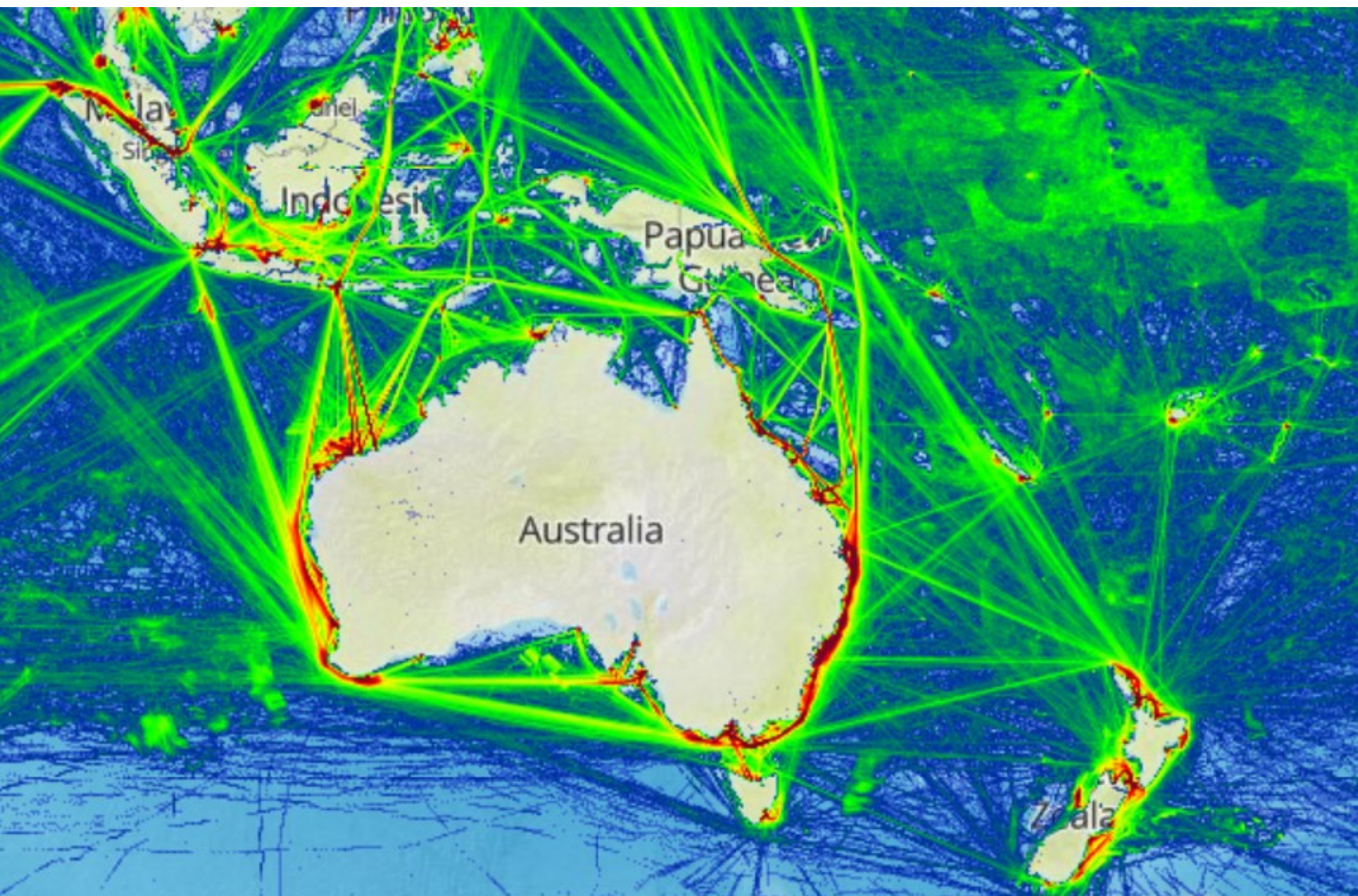






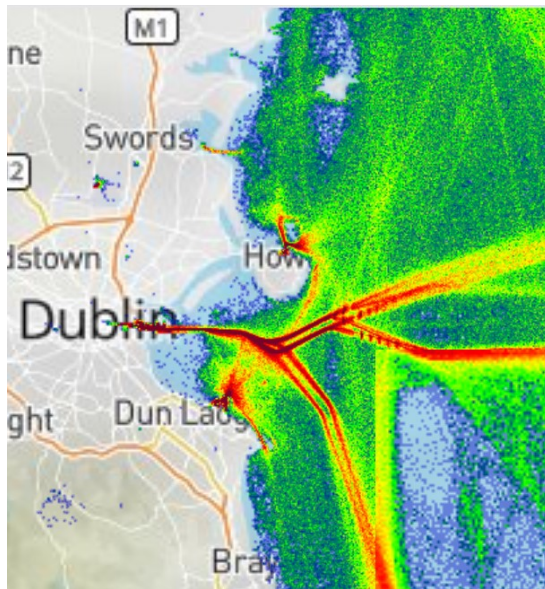




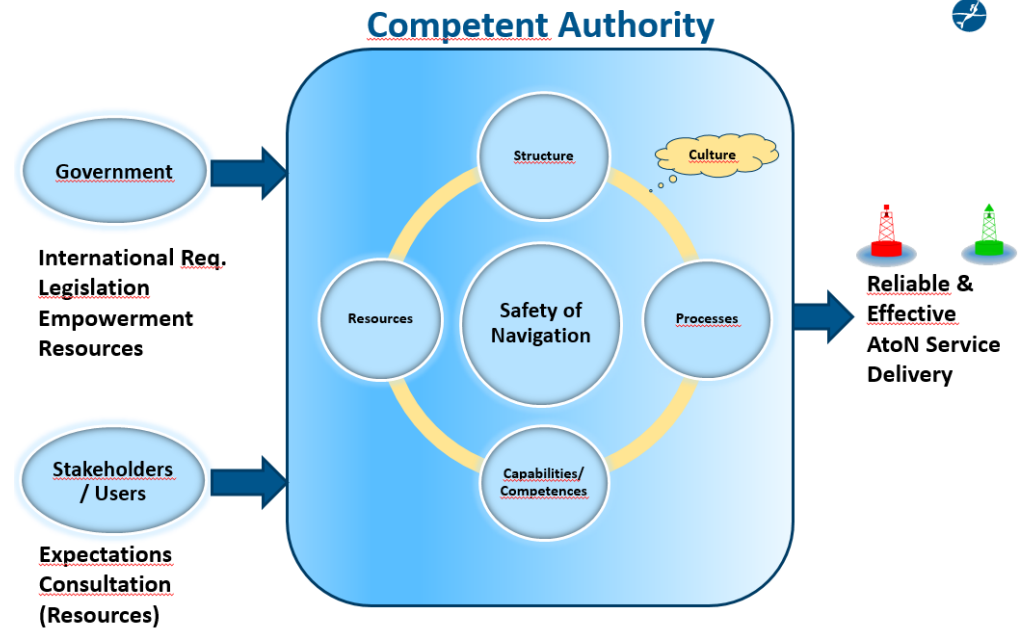


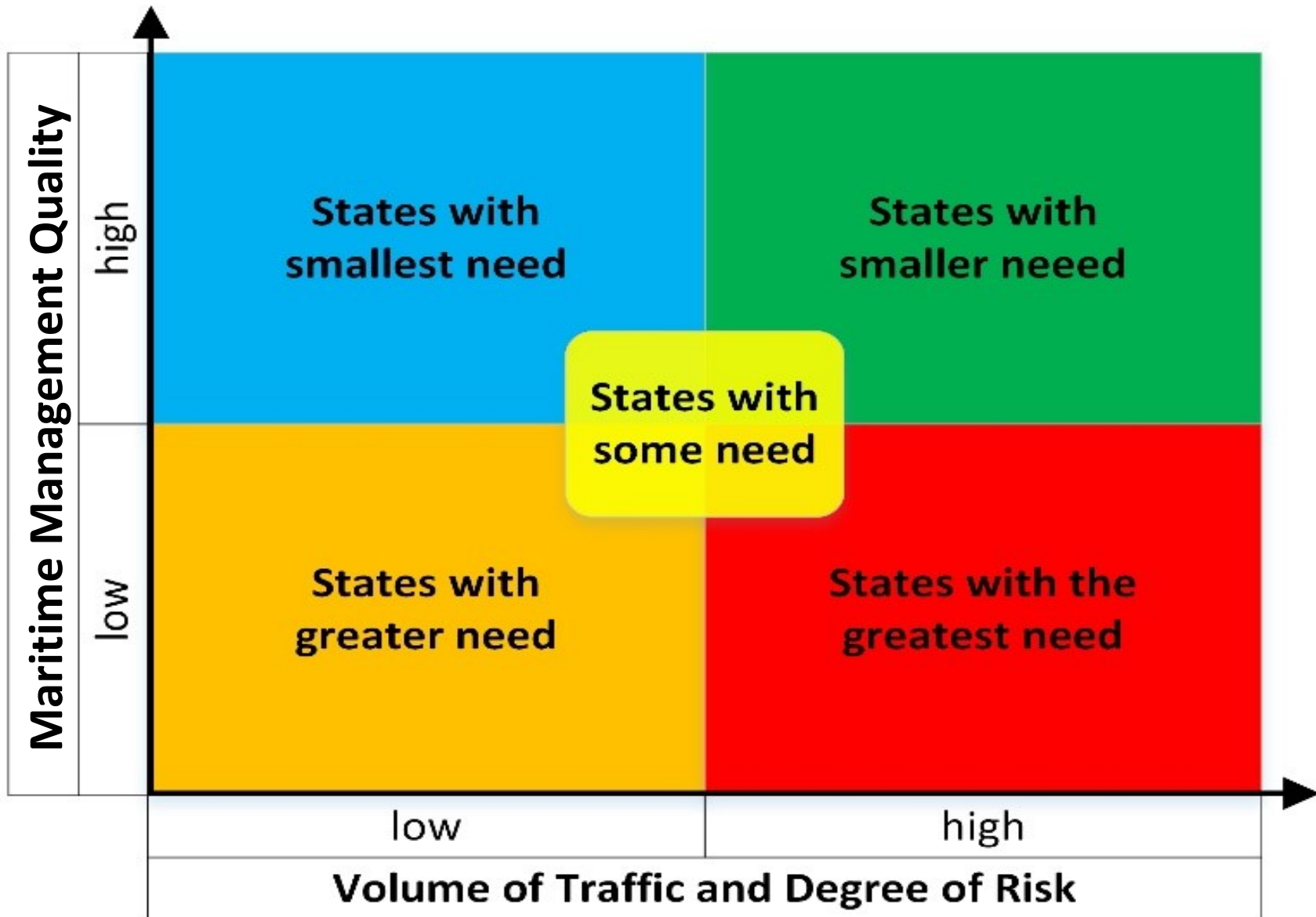


Volume of Traffic and Degree of Risk

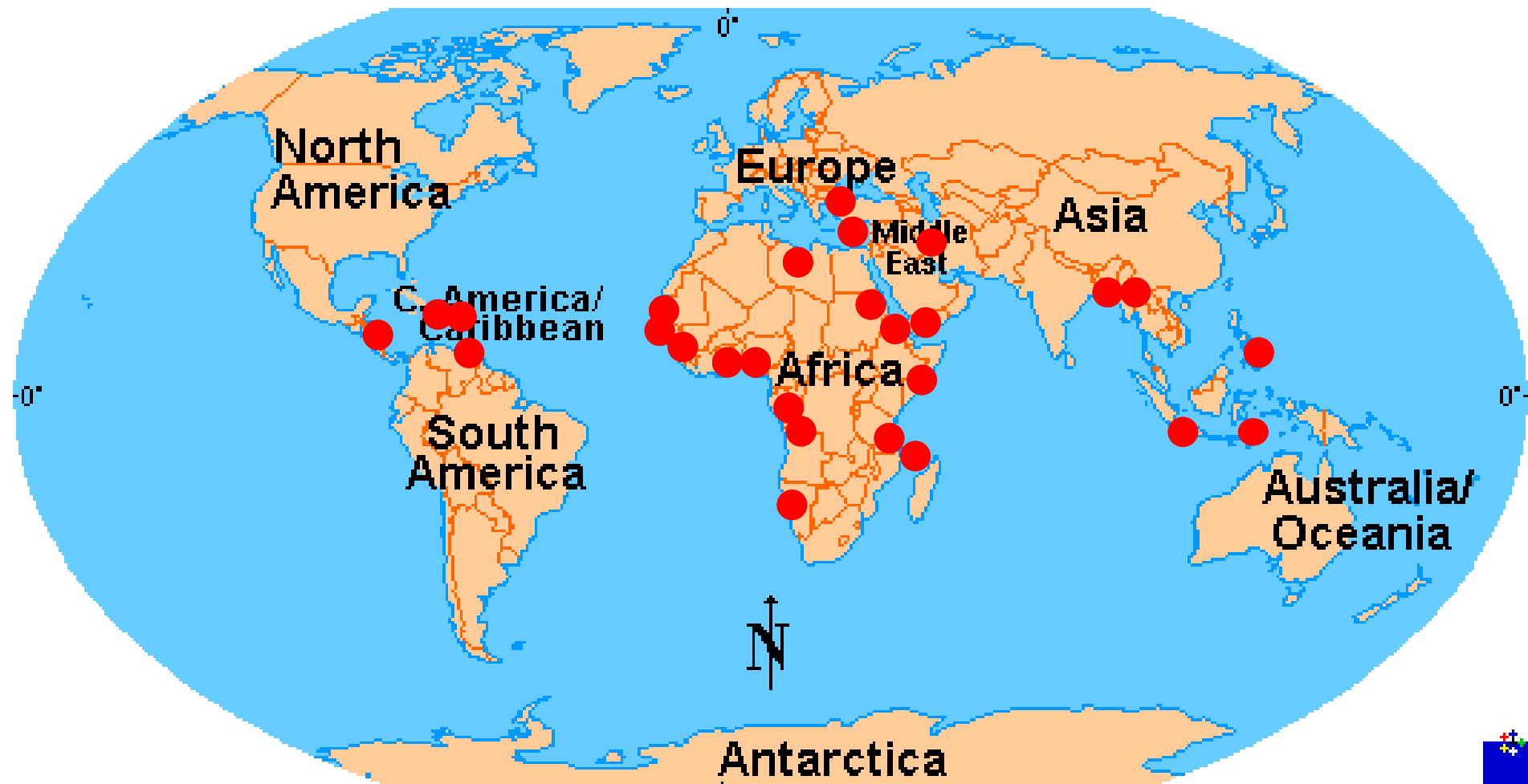

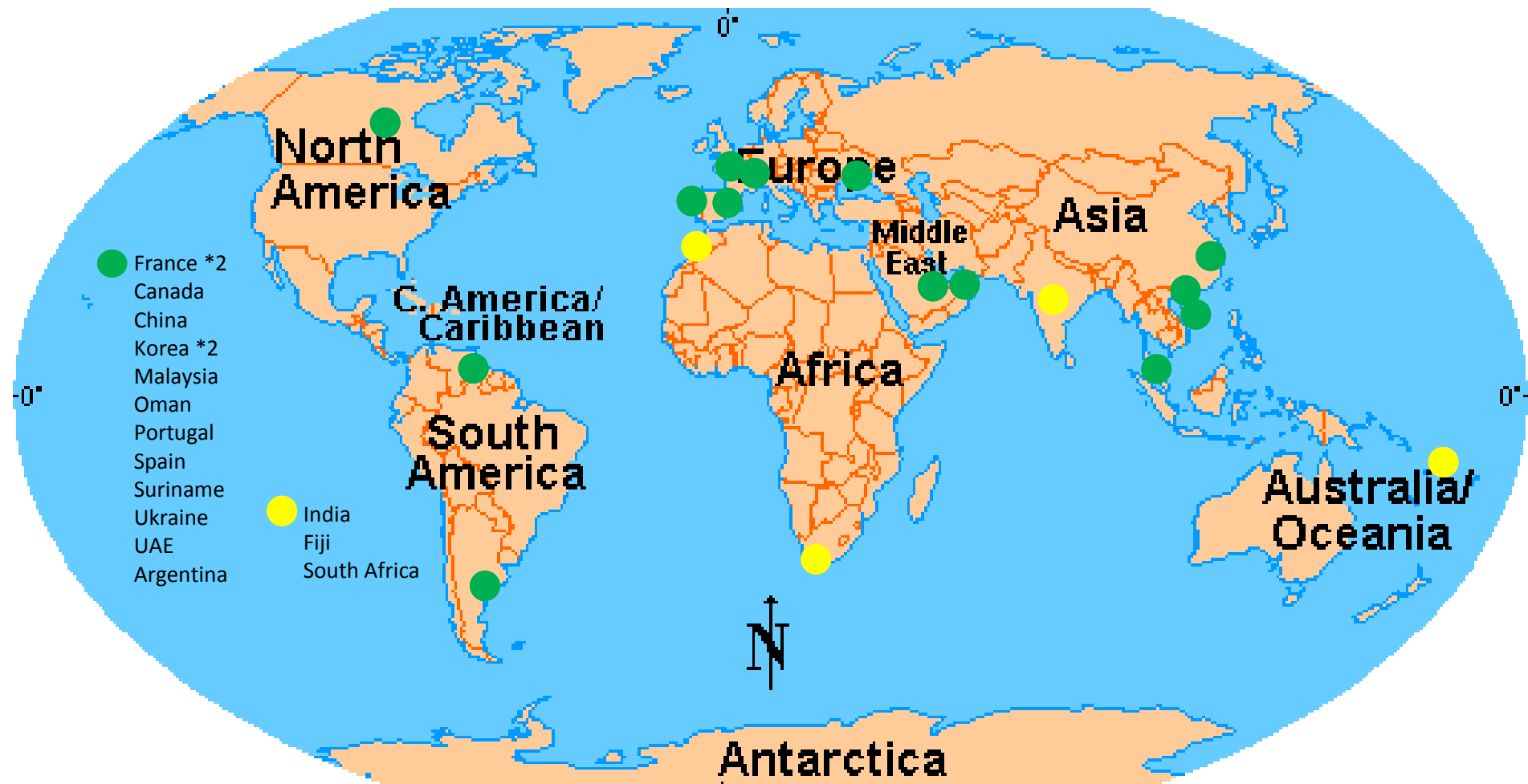

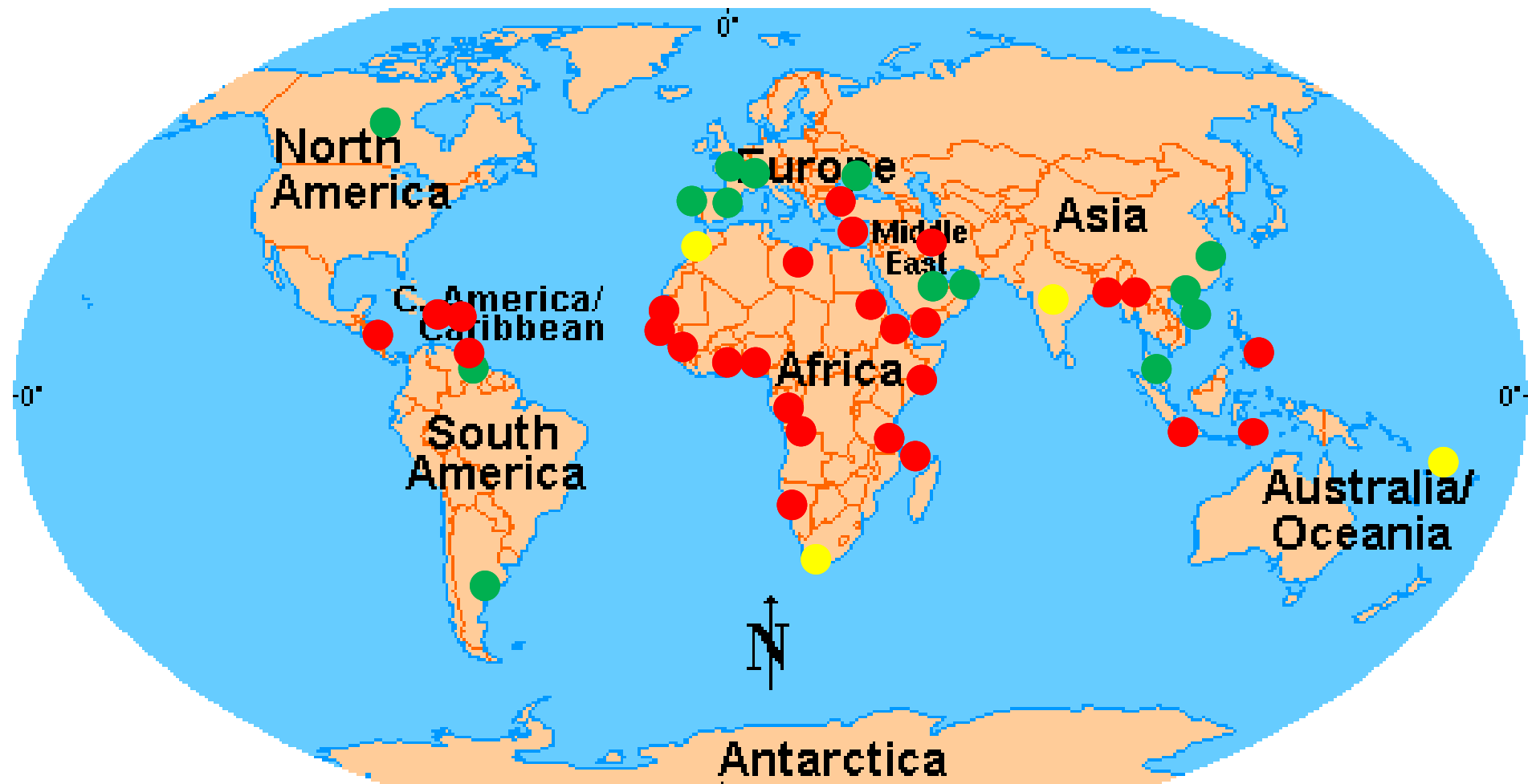


Accredited Training Organizations (AtO)●



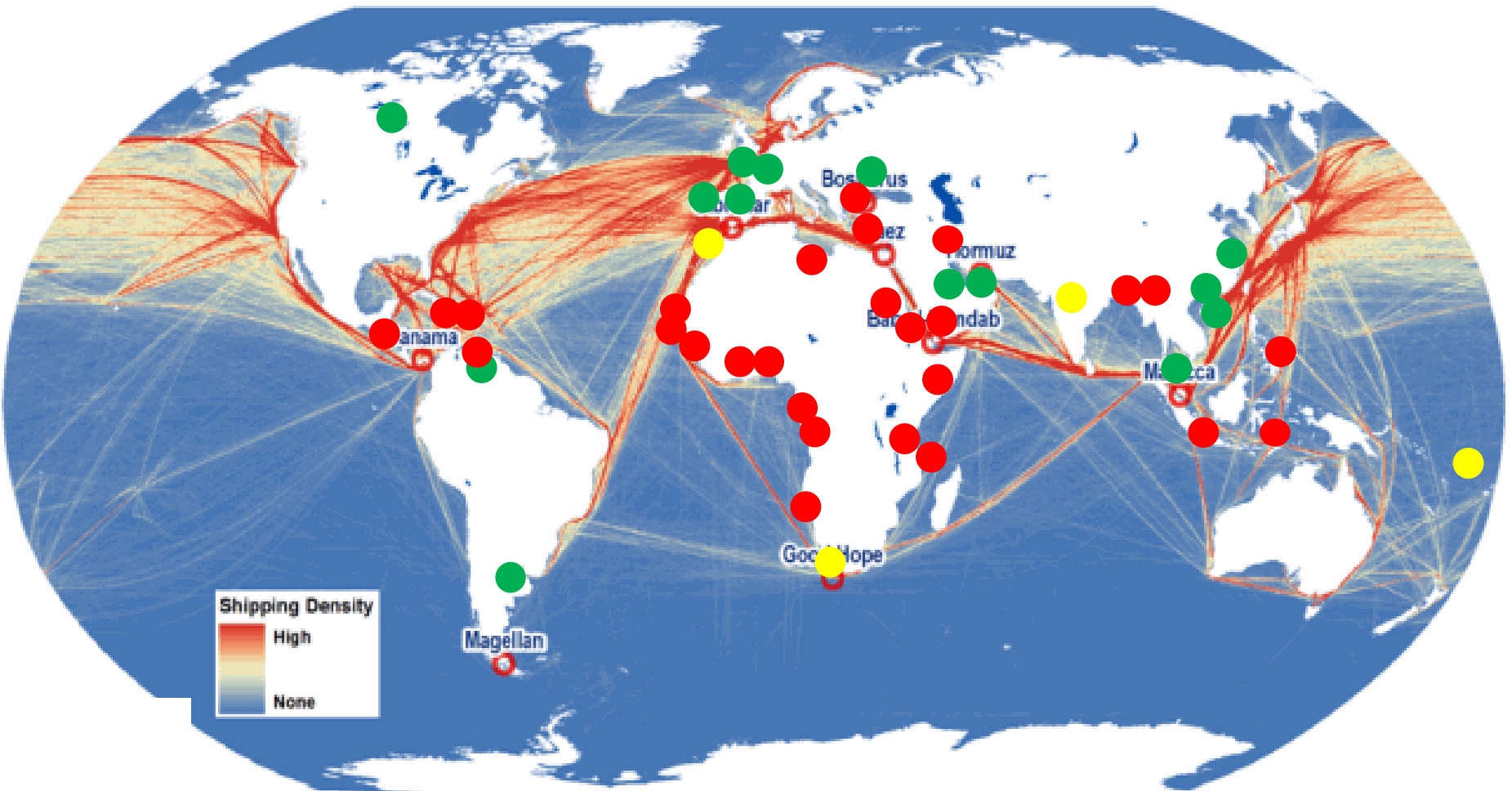

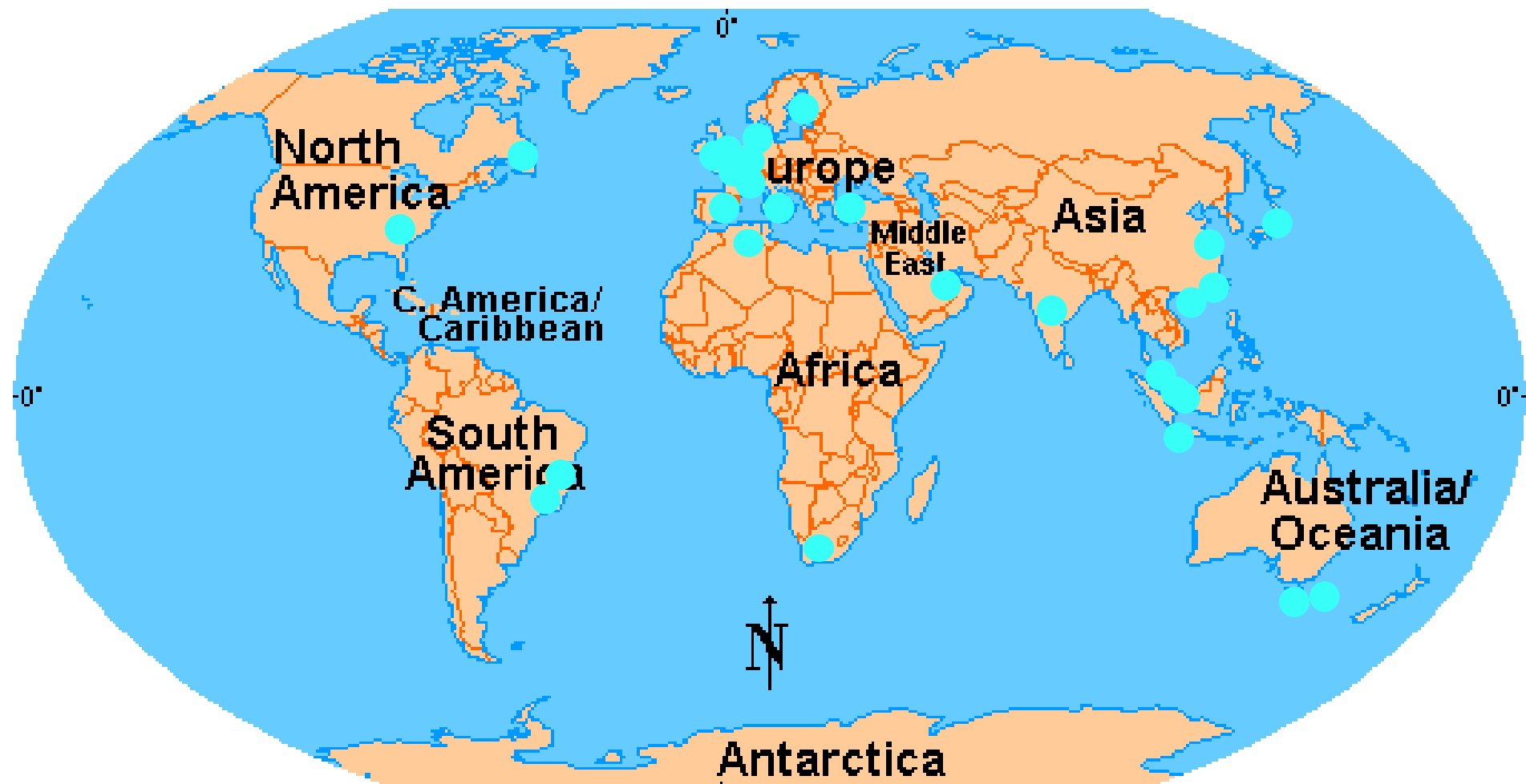




Traffic Density

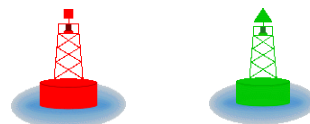
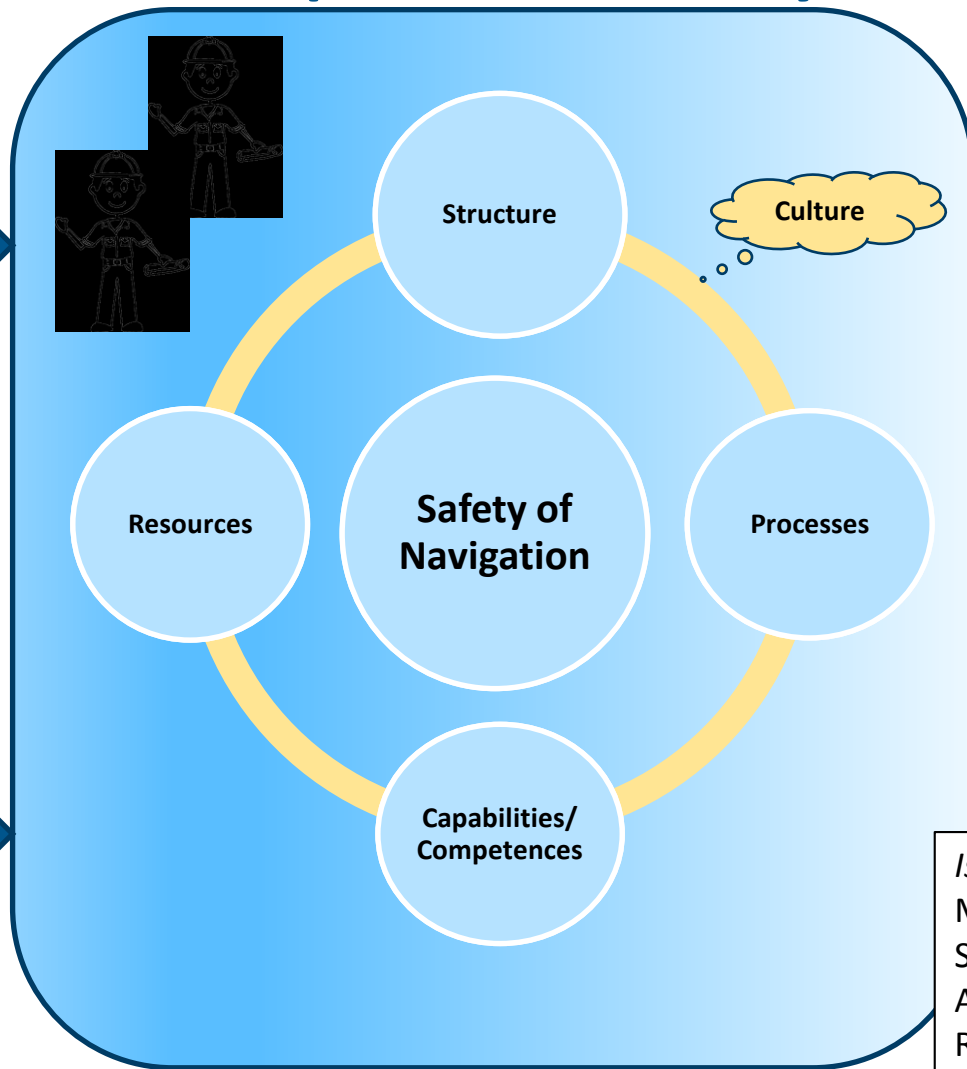
